


# The Middle Passage



The Middle Passage was the stage of the triangular trade in which millions of Africans were shipped to the New World as part of the Atlantic slave trade. The Middle Passage refers to the part of the trade where Africans, densely packed onto ships, were transported across the Atlantic to the West Indies. The Middle Passage, For weeks, months, sometimes as long as a year, they waited in the dungeons of the slave factories scattered along Africa's western coast. This illustration depicts what one reporter saw on the upper deck of a slave ship "about four hundred and fifty native Africans, in a sitting or squatting posture.
